BEE HEALTH TRAINING EVALUATION REPORT FOR WEST AFRICA



The following is an evaluation report of the bee health training that was conducted by AU-IBAR in West Africa from 23rd June to 27th June 2014.

A questionnaire was administered to each of the 45 participants in the workshop and the responses were recorded in Microsoft excel. Stata software was then used to generate the various percentages. A five point likert scale approach which was balanced on both sides was used. Table 1 shows the results of the evaluation.

- As shown in the above table, more than 80% of the respondents agreed that the training objectives were well communicated with 68.89% agreeing and 13.33% totally agreeing.
- 53% of the respondents were not content with the time allotted for each subject. However, 37% reported that the time was adequate.
- 68% of the respondents found it easy to follow the training materials while 13% of the respondents did not find the training materials easy to follow.
- 79% of the respondents indicated that the practical sessions were relevant to their work 11% indicated otherwise.
- More than 82% of the respondents indicated that they would use the skills they learned in this training.
- 84% of the respondents would recommend this training to others in their country.
- The training was satisfactory to 80% of the respondents and unsatisfactory to 9% of the respondents.
- 81.82% of the respondents indicated that the training was appropriate. 6.08% reported that the content was too advanced while 11.08% indicated that the content was too basic.
- More than 52% of the respondents indicated that the time assigned for the training component was insufficient. 36.36% reported that it was appropriate while 11.36% indicated that it was too much.
- More than 74% of the respondents indicated that their trip was well organized. However, according to 13% of the respondents, their trip was not well organized.
- The accommodation was adequate as indicated by more than 76% of the respondents. 11% of the respondent indicated that the accommodation was not adequate.
